Attending your exams

1. Arrive at least 10 minutes before the examination is due to begin
2. You should bring the equipment you need and know what equipment is allowed for each exam. You can bring the following items into your exams:
 - a. black pens (no erasable pens)
 - b. pencils (must be at least 2B)
 - c. erasers and a sharpener
 - d. a ruler marked in millimetres and centimetres
 - e. highlighter pens
 - f. a clear bottle of water with no label
 - g. a non-programmable watch, which you must take off, place on your desk in clear view and not touch during the exam
 - h. You need to bring certain equipment (like a calculator) for some exams.
3. You **must not** bring any of the following items into your exams:
 - a. mobile phones
 - b. programmable watches, eg smart watches
 - c. any electronic devices (except a calculator, if allowed), including communication devices, organisers, tablets, music players, earphones or electronic dictionaries
 - d. paper or any printed or written material (including your exam timetable)
 - e. dictionaries (except in language exams, if allowed)
 - f. correction fluid or correction tape
4. You cannot borrow equipment during exams
5. During each exam, you must not:
 - a. start writing until the supervisor tells you to (eg Reading time), or continue to write when the supervisor tells you to stop
 - b. write on anything other than writing books, answer booklets or other writing material provided by the presiding officer
 - c. leave the room, except in an emergency
 - d. leave (finish) the exam in the first hour
 - e. take an exam paper out of the room
 - f. leave your seat without permission
6. Follow MHS's usual rules
7. Behave politely and take exams seriously
8. During each exam, **you must**:
 - a. always follow the supervisors' instructions
make a serious attempt at the exam by answering a range of question types (answering only multiple-choice questions is not considered a serious attempt – you may have the course cancelled)
 - b. answer in English, unless the question paper directs otherwise
 - c. behave politely and courteously towards the supervisors and other students.
9. During each exam, **you must not**:
 - a. cheat
 - b. include frivolous or objectionable material
 - c. take any of the items prohibited in section into the room
 - d. speak to anyone other than a supervisor
 - e. behave in any way likely to disturb another student or upset the running of the exam
 - f. be affected by alcohol or illegal drugs
 - g. eat unless approved by the school (eg if you have diabetes)
 - h. take any writing booklets or exam paper, whether used or not, out of the room
 - i. write on your body (eg your arms), tissues or material that is not exam material
