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RELIEVING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As the school year comes to an end there are a number of people I would like to acknowledge, in no particular order:

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- * Mrs Karen Nicol for her support of public education whilst principal of Morisset High School
- * The teaching staff of Morisset High School for their dedication, professionalism and resilience.
- * The executive staff who have worked tirelessly in planning and refining as they encourage and support improvements in student outcomes.
- * The classroom support staff who assist both teachers and students with the purpose of improving learning outcomes for students.
- * The general assistant and cleaning staff who work tirelessly to create an attractive and engaging school environment.
- * The administration support staff who assist staff and students as well as professionally dealing with members from the community.
- * The P&C who are always seeking ways to improve the learning environment for the students.
- * The wider parent community who support both the students and staff so that the children get the best opportunities available for progress and success.
- * The students of Morisset High School, of whom the vast majority are supportive of the school and who, through their achievements, make it a rewarding experience to be a teacher.
- * All of the community members who have supported our students by providing work placement positions.

<u>New Principal</u>

Hopefully, by the end of the year we will know who the new principal is. A panel of 5 people will make the final decision. That panel consists of the School Education Director, a representative from the Aboriginal community, a staff representative, a parent representative and a serving principal.

<u>Sun Safe</u>

It is timely to remind students to apply plenty of sun screen, wear a hat and keep hydrated when undertaking physical activity or when venturing out into the sun. There is a supply of sun screen kept in the office for staff and student use.

Staff Development Days

The last Monday and Tuesday of term 4 are staff development days. Students do not attend on those days. On the Monday we will be examining strategies for building closer links with our Aboriginal community and developing ways of embedding Aboriginal perspectives into all areas of the curriculum. On Tuesday we will be focussing on new initiatives in literacy and examining ways to improve the school tone.

Day one of Term 1 2012 (27th January) is also a staff development day. The agenda will partly be determined by the new principal but one area will be the mandatory training in the new OH&S legislation.

Higher School and School Certificate

Mrs Courts, the presiding officer, reported that everything went smoothly during the exams. She complemented the students on their cooperation and behaviour. Mrs Courts has been the presiding officer for ten years and this is her final year so I would like to publicly recognise her efforts over those years in delivering smoothly run external exams.

I also wish to acknowledge the support given to our Higher School Certificate students by Reverend Glen Pope. Reverend Pope makes the church hall available thereby ensuring a quiet environment for our students.

<u>School Reports</u>

As I write reports are being finalised. From reading every report it is obvious that some students have work particularly well throughout the year enabling them to achieve personal best results. It is always disappointing to note a small number of students who have failed to take advantage of the opportunities presented to them.

Priority School Funding

Early 2012 all parents of students in years 7, 8 and 9 will be surveyed about their income level, occupation and educational qualifications. The surveys are anonymous. It is vital that we get as close to 100% of surveys back as possible. If we are successful the school will get a considerable boost in money and staffing to support additional programs and the purchase of extra resources. There will be a meeting early next year and I encourage all those affected to attend.

<u>Hall upgrade</u>

The hall has been upgraded so that it now has an excellent sound system and a retractable screen. The final piece will be a data projector attached to the roof, when funds become available. This allows staff and students to deliver more professional and entertaining presentations.

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Expectations

I often say to students I expect three things from them:

- * regular attendance
- * wear the correct school uniform
- * follow instructions

because when they get a job employers expect you to turn up, wear the right gear and do as you are instructed. To that end there has been a push on school uniform and there has been a significant improvement. This will continue in 2012 so please ensure your child has the correct uniform, including black, fully enclosed leather shoes.

We have also been working closely with the Home School Liaison Officer to develop support mechanisms for those students who find it difficult to attend school every day. The school has implemented strategies to respond to those students who don't attend all lessons.

School finances

Due to declining student numbers it is anticipated that the total amount of funds available for distribution to the faculties will be 12% less next year. One way parents can help offset this expected decrease is to pay the school contribution, either as a lump sum or in instalments.

Mrs T Carlton -(Head Teacher) relinquished her position at Morisset High School due to declining student numbers.





ALL year 7 students will be offered:

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- hepatitis B vaccine
- chickenpox vaccine
- diphtheria, tetanus & pertussis (whooping cough) combination vaccine

Year 7 female students will also be offered:

• Human papillomavirus vaccine

Students cannot be vaccinated unless a completed and signed consent form is returned to school.

Look out for consent forms early in 2012!

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SCIENCE REPORT

For the final Morissetian 2011, I would like to thank all the Science and Agriculture Teachers for a fantastic year with their classes. There were many extra tasks taken on by the Science staff and by our students ranging from changing the school sign, involvements and organisation of various competitions including the Tocal Steer challenge and Gosford Show as well as the Science and Engineering Challenge; organising the computer rooms to conduct ESSA and maintenance of the Farm and the rainforest. A visit from the Snake man for year 8 and involvement in GATS day and Showcase evening as well as a display for Education Week.

Thanks also to all parents who were able to attend on Parent/Teacher evenings. A big thanks to all Parents who supported their children being involved in these activities and to those Parents who were able to assist on the days.

Science Staff developed new and interesting assessment tasks in which students performed well, preparing the way for improving results in ESSA, the School Certificate and the Higher School Certificate. We eagerly await our results, with all the hard work done. We have been planning ahead for 2012 and developing computer skills to further implement the DER laptops into laboratory and farm situations. To fully engage with lessons we ask the students to have their laptops fully charged and to be wearing full school uniform including enclosed black leather or vinyl shoes (please see separate article outlining the school's uniform requirements). Students need a basic "toolbox" of stationery. They need to have a few pens, pencils, eraser, ruler and calculator with them at all times, as well as their Science books. We would appreciate you ensuring that the toolbox is kept topped up and in their bags.

We look forward to 2012 and having your children in our classes, eager to learn and listening to and following instructions to learn as much as they can through practical experiences and follow this up with writing, in their own words, extended responses of what they have learnt or an analysis/evaluation of a concept giving their supported opinion.

At the start of the year, all students will receive a course outline of all the topics for the year, all the assessment tasks and approximate dates for the task. We ask them to paste it in the front of their book on the first day, please feel free to check this. Closer to the assessment date the students will receive notification 2 to 4 weeks before it is due. Please also check the School's website for this information in 2012.

A huge amount of thanks and praise go to the tireless efforts of our farm and lab assistants, Ian and Joneen. They are such driven professional and friendly people who manage their areas wonderfully and way beyond their regular hours. We could not do it without Joneen and Ian!! Your children look up to them as well and appreciate their input into their learning at Morisset High School.

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


Yr 9 Food Technology
